

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COP Objectives

By sharing our resources and innovative practices, this COP intends to build the capacity of COEs to serve as regional backbone support for the following outcomes in each county:

- Supporting access to regular and ongoing environmental and outdoor learning experiences for students, by working with school districts, teachers, and community-based partners. This work centers on supporting those from the most vulnerable and marginalized communities.
- Supporting development of district-wide plans that include experiences for students at all grade levels, with an emphasis on low income students and students of color.
- Applying frameworks that integrate environmental literacy and sustainability into the curriculum, campus, community, and culture.
- Infusing sustainability principles and practices into COE core operations.

Survey Results (23–24)

Student Response




- 95% (1,067 respondents) were students
- 40% feel the school is doing enough
- 60% do not or are unsure
- 39% report some aspect of their health (mental/emotional, physical) being impacted

Concern levels

- 91% of all responses indicate concern (from slightly to extremely concerned)
- Only 9% of responses indicate no concern
- 83% report feeling over moderate concern






What students what to be improved:

- Most pressing issues that were reported become the focus of our yearly project
- 2024-2025 goal: The Trash Pact
- Waste audits conducted at Aptos, San Lorenzo Valley, and Soquel to measure current waste streams
- Huge lack of correct management + access; need for improved systems

Ten Strands CA Youth Climate Policy Program

CYCP is a knowledge to action program that supports youth to lead an advocacy campaign to pass policy actions (or builds on existing policies) in their school or district. Students receive mentoring from adult coaches and support in developing a personal leadership plan and advocacy campaign. The program is a partnership between Ten Strands, UndauntedK12, and the Sierra Club.

Key dates:

- <u>Applications</u> due May 27.
- Applicants will hear back in mid June.
- Program runs July 2025 January 2026.







THE ECOLOGIK INSTITUTE

The mission of the EcoLogik Institute is to empower young women to be champions for nature, innovators in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, warriors for environmental stewardship, leaders in their communities, and changemakers who create a positive impact on the world around them.

• 3 Pillars:

- Summer Experience free 2-week STEM summer day camp for underrepresented girls, ages 10 - 16. This unique program fuses ecology and technology to connect youth to the natural resources and science of America's National Parks.
- In the Community free workshops, afterschool programming, and STEAM Fairs in the larger San Diego community
- Leadership Academy creates a continuum of support for the young women who have participated in the summer experience or apprenticeship program by offering ongoing learning and internship opportunities, career development, female mentorship, and a community of alumnae.
