


Welcome



What is CAELI?

The California Environmental <u>Literacy Initiative (CAELI)</u>, led by Ten Strands, works statewide to change the education system so that it supports environmental literacy with a focus on equity, inclusion, and cultural relevance for all students.



This collective impact network works with guidance from a leadership council composed of action oriented innovation hubs.

District COP Objectives

The core purpose of the District Community of Practice is to convene district leaders, educators, and support staff who are engaged in building environmental literacy and sustainability efforts within their schools. Through collaboration, shared learning, and resource exchange, this CoP supports district-wide innovation and alignment toward systems-level change.

Key outcomes of this district CoP include:

- Integration of environmental sustainability principles and practices into the district's operational, instructional, and cultural frameworks.
- Building the capacity of site and district leaders to implement whole-school sustainability models that touch campus, curriculum, community, and culture.



Action Model

Based on the desire to more fully center equity and to grow the number of people and representation of those directly involved with the initiative, CAELI began to re-envision the structure in early 2020. The COVID crisis and shift to virtual work accelerated this reimagining and Ten Strands facilitated a restructuring process that included the development of a new theory of action and a new governance structure based on shared leadership and self governance by summer 2021.

Between Fall 2021 and Spring 2024, Ten Strands supported the pilot of CAELI under the newly revised CAELI Theory of Action, and collective action structure. The new structure required additional backbone support guidance including annual "CAELIenders", examples of collective action working group projects, a summary of annual goals and working group projects for innovation hubs and CAELI-Wide working groups ("snapshots"), processes for managing the use of funds on collective action projects, support for managing and recruiting CAELI members, and draft metrics. In 2023-24, CAELI expanded the collective action structure to include CAELI-Wide Working Groups that focus on different focus area initiatives (i.e. Green Ribbon, Metrics, etc.).

Purpose and Overview: This document provides an overview of the different opportunities for participation in the California Environmental Literacy Initiative (CAELI) network. All members are welcomed and encouraged to attend CAELI Quarterly meetings and CAELI Events.

Member Tier	Membership Overview
CAELI Participant 5-20 hours annually	CAELI Participants are people who participate in CAELI programs and networks, and are invited to CAELI Quarterly meetings. Examples of what a participant might attend includes the following: communities of practice, webinars, fellowships, networks, in-person meet-ups, etc.
CAELI Project Activator 20 - 40 hours annually	CAELI Project Activators contribute to one or more CAELI collective action projects - see 2025-26 projects here. Activators also participate in CAELI programs and networks, and should attend CAELI Quarterly meetings.
CAELI Project Initiative Leader 40 - 60 hours annually	CAELI Project Initiative Leaders, commit to leading (or co-leading) a CAELI Collective Action Project during the CAELI season. Leadership responsibilities include project management (drafting and submitting a <u>project proposol</u>) planning and focilitating working group meetings, overseeing project budget, revising and providing final review, etc.).
	CAELI Project Initiative Leaders are also expected to attend a virtual CAELI Leadership Reterat in July (7/27/25), an in-person retreat in November (11/12/25), and to attend monthly CAELI Leadership meetings in between each Quarterly CAELI Leaders can till up to \$1,000 for this additional leadership time beyond their project leadership.
CAELI Core Leadership Team 60 - 100 hours annually for Co-Chairs	The CAELI Core Leadership Team is the highest level of engagement for a CAELI member and requires sustained and dedicated leadership to the collective action network. Contributors to this team include: • CAELI Project Director (currently Ten Strands): Provides backbone support to CAELI core operations and project teams. • CAELI Co-Chairs (stipended position): Work with the CAELI project director and CAELI support staff to provide governance oversight, set strategic direction, support CAELI project teams, and support planning and facilitation of CAELI virtual and in-person gathering.

CAELI is a shared leadership model with different levels of membership engagement.

Guests might include practitioner advisors (administrators, teachers, staff,

students, partners, etc.) who support a webingr or community of practice.



a process that increases public awareness and knowledge about environmental issues or problems. In doing so, it provides the public with the necessary skills to make informed decisions and take responsible action.










Blueprint Highlights: Guiding Principles

Guiding Principles

- **Equity of Access**: We must achieve environmental literacy for all California students, not just a few.
- Sustainability and Scalability of Systems: We must identify and commit to securing dedicated and sustained funding sources for environmental literacy and work within the current context of California's education transformation to harness momentum and create long-term impact.
- Collaborative Solutions: Collaboration among the many stakeholders and community partners involved in environmental literacy is critical to implementing the recommendations contained in this document.
- Commitment to Quality: Students must have access to high-quality learning experiences and materials inside and outside of the classroom that cultivate environmental literacy. Formal and informal educators must have access to high-quality professional learning opportunities.
- Cultural Relevance and Competence: The success of environmental literacy efforts in California will hinge upon culturally competent educators utilizing educational resources and approaches that are responsive to the culture and experiences of the state's diverse students and families.
 - Variety of Learning Experiences: Students can best develop environmental literacy through a combination of learning experiences in and out of the classroom, including outdoor and informal education, experiences in green school buildings and grounds, in students' local parks, and in residential outdoor science programs.


